Since October 2005, Connecticut's Operation Gift Cards program has distributed 3,250 "Thank You" kits, including \$65,000 in PX (military store) gift certificates, to wounded and injured troops at Walter Reed and Bethesda Military Hospitals in Washington, DC.

On the last visit, representatives from four units of the Marine Corps League, American Veterans (AMVETS), the Military Order of the Purple Heart and Disabled American Veterans visited wounded soldiers and personally thanked them for their service to their country and for their sacrifice for freedom. Each patient was presented with four "Thank You" kits (each from a different unit) containing a custom-designed thank you card with a group picture of the sponsoring chapter or post, a \$20 gift certificate for the military store (\$80 total in gift certificates), and flyers about programs the sponsoring service organization has developed that may be of interest to the patients. Operation Gift Cards also delivers items that are on the "Wish List" on the right.

Operation Gift Cards was started jointly by the Disabled American Veterans Stamford Chapter #13 and the Military Order of the Purple Heart Shelton/Derby Chapter #1. Twenty-three other veterans units have joined Operation Gift Cards. The goal is to have a different group of veterans units **collectively** purchase each month between \$3,000 and \$4,000 in gift certificates in order to present all visited wounded patients in Walter Reed and Bethesda hospitals with at least three "Thank You" kits containing between \$60-\$100 in gift certificates.
