Connecticut veterans present \$3,000 in Gift Certificates to our wounded and injured troops in Walter Reed and Bethesda military hospitals on behalf of three October co-sponsors

Since October 2005, the Operation Gift Cards' 49 monthly visits have presented 7,430 Thank You Kits which contained \$148,600 in military department store gift certificates to our wounded troops. An additional \$77,500 in other gift certificates and special group product donations (Girl Scout cookies, corporate gift certificates etc.) have been delivered to the Soldier Family Assistance Center, the Fisher Houses, the Mologne House, the Navy Lodge, the Red Cross, and the Bethesda Casualty Affairs Office, along with tens of thousands of dollars worth items on the "wish list" (listed on the right) for both the wounded troops and their families.

On the last visit, representatives from the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and the employees of No Vet Left Behind visited wounded soldiers and personally thanked them for their service to their country and for their sacrifice for freedom. Each patient was presented with 3 "Thank You" kits containing a custom-designed thank you card with a picture of the co-sponsor's members, a \$20 gift certificate for the military store (\$60 total in gift certificates), and, if appropriate, flyers about programs the co-sponsor has developed that may be of interest to the patients.

Thirty-nine units and individuals have co-sponsored Operation Gift Cards. The program goal is to have a different group of co-sponsors collectively purchase, each month, between \$3,000 and \$4,000 in gift certificates in order to present all visited wounded patients in Walter Reed and Bethesda hospitals with at least three "Thank You" kits containing between \$60-\$120 in gift certificates.

Commissary (food purchases) and Exchange (department store) Certif-checks for families (to order-1(877) 770-4438), taxi gift certificates (Taxi Company-Barwood 1-800-831-2323), Metro transportation gift certificates, restaurant cards (in DC), phone cards greater than 60 minutes, Gift Certificates from Staples, Home Depot, Office Depot, CVS, Giant, Target and Safeway, VCR/DVD combination players, umbrellas and rain ponchos. Auto shut off irons and ironing boards. Air mattresses with pumps. Non-perishable foods and snacks, condiments, ketchup, mustard, peanut butter, coffee, tea, sugar, sweeteners, coffee creamers, cereal bars & pop tarts, single serving sizes of canned goods and convenience foods that do not require refrigeration. Things easy to take on the go to the hospital.

Consumables: toilet paper, Kleenex, laundry detergent, bleach, fabric sheets for dryer, paper towels, napkins, batteries AA, AAA, C and D, light bulbs 60 watts (energy efficient), cleaning supplies, soft scrub, sponges, toilet cleaners, dish washer detergent, liquid soap refills. Tooth brushes, toothpaste, deodorant, disposable razors and shave cream.
